- grievances can be heard, and
- common ground can be found.

Over the course of this day, we will reflect on the past (but we will not be stuck in the past), examine tools for non-violent conflict resolution, and explore pathways to strengthen Lebanon's national resilience.

These discussions are not theoretical—they are deeply practical and deeply political. They challenge us to imagine a Lebanon in which difference is no longer a threat but a source of strength.

I would like to thank all the speakers and moderators and all of you in the audience for joining us today, and in particular our partners at Maison du Futur under the leadership of President Amine Gemayel and my colleagues of the KAS Lebanon team for their enduring commitment to dialogue and reform.
